Hallelujahs for Haiti



On Saturday, November 13, 2010, at 2:30 p.m., more than 500 voices from 60 churches throughout The Presbytery of Philadelphia will join together in song and praise, singing hallelujah to raise desperately needed funds for Hopital St. Croix in Léogâne, Haiti. This hospital and associated nursing school were severely damaged in the January 12, 2010, earthquake. These facilities have long been supported by the Presbyterian Church USA.

This celebration in the Kimmel Center's Verizon Hall will be directed by Dr. Pearl Shangkuan, professor of music at Calvin College in Grand Rapids, Michigan. Dr. Martin Marty, well-known and highly respected theologian, will present a liturgy he has written that weaves the repertoire together. In addition, an anthem has been commissioned for One Joyful Choir by composer John Ferguson. Dr. Ferguson will also be in attendance and accompany this work on the Fred J. Cooper Memorial Organ.
